Trinity Lutheran Instrumental Music Program

Dear Trinity Families,

I am looking forward running the instrumental music program this year at Trinity. There is a long tradition of providing excellent musical instruction and I am proud to continue to uphold that tradition. Attached to this letter you will find the registration form for instrumental music. Please know that orchestral instruments begin in 3rd grade and band instruments begin in 4th grade. Also, know that students are allowed to switch from orchestral to band instruments in 4th grade if they wish to play in band.

In addition to the registration form, there is a supply list for all instruments. All students are required to have their own instruments to bring to and from school for their lessons and rehearsals. Larger instruments (Baritone Saxophone, Tuba, Euphonium, and String Bass) will be provided at school for lessons and rehearsals but an instrument should still be obtained for home practice. The school does have a collection of instruments that are available for student use when their instrument is being repaired or in non-working condition. These instruments are not there for continuous use. Please contact me if you have any questions regarding providing instruments.

Lessons and rehearsals will begin the week of September 11th. Students will not be able to participate in lessons until their registration fee has been sent in, they will however be encouraged to participate in rehearsals until their forms have been submitted.

Also included in this packet you will find a list of vendors that rent or sell instruments. If you are considering buying an instrument for your child, please feel free to ask about which brands would be recommended.

Congratulations on joining the Band Program at Trinity. Below you will find the supplies needed for you instrument. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to reach out to me.

Each instrument has some supplies that are unique to that instrument. The list below will list both the individual supplies and what everyone will need.

Every instrumentalist will need a copy of the "Accent on Achievement Book 1" method book. These books are instrument specific and provide a wealth of information to the beginning student. Students will also need a half inch binder or folder to hold their music in. A music stand and tuner are also recommended for use at home while practicing.

Congratulations on joining the Orchestral Program at Trinity. Below you will find the supplies needed for your success in the program. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.

When selecting a string instrument for you child it is important to bring them with you to the music store as these instruments come in various sizes. The music store personnel should be able to assist you in selecting an instrument that will best fit your child. I recommend renting for the first few years as they will likely outgrow their smaller instruments over time. However, some stores have great deals when purchasing too. Please refrain from buying instruments found at Target, Walmart, Toys R Us, or online. Many times these instruments are or a poor quality and only lead to frustration on the student's part.

All students also need a half inch binder or folder to put practice papers in.

A music stand and tuner are also recommended for home practice. These can be found online often cheaper than in stores or a tuner app can be downloaded onto a "smart" device.

For Violin and Viola students I recommend a sponge style shoulder rest until they reach middle school. These shoulder rests are more comfortable for growing students and stay in place easier. Cello students need an end pin "slip stop" or "rock stop" these help hold the cello in place when practicing and prevent damage to floors.
